Have you ever needed to edit a PDF in Illustrator? or maybe just open a PDF file to copy a few items? If you have, then you know that you have to open the PDF and select the page you want to open, close the file, and if you need to work on another page, you have no choice but to repeat the process... as many times as is needed. It gets annoying very quickly, there should be an easier way, right? Right, using a script, it will basically do all that boring work for us. Download: [AI\\_openMultiPagePDF\\_CS4\\_CS5.v1.02.zip](#) Installing and execution scripts This script worked wonders for me in Adobe Illustrator CS to open multiple pages of PDFs in Illustrator with each page of pdf ending up on its own artboard. I've also tested it and it works well on Illustrator CC to import multiple pages from a pdf in Illustrator as well. To use the script to open all the pages in your PDF. Download the script from [AI Scripts](#). After downloading the script, move it to the [Illustrator CC/Presets](#) folder Then just access the script via [File > scripts](#) Set the file path to the pdf file you want to import into Illustrator. And the Illustrator script will work: The result in Illustrator is a single artboard file for each imported page in the PDF. When Illustrator updates when you upgrade your version of Illustrator by downloading the latest version from Adobe, you may notice that the script is missing. You must go to your folder of programs and move (or copy) the script file to the same Scripts folder. You can upload artwork from PDFs to Using the Open command, the Insert command, the Paste command, and the Drag-and-Drop function. From the March 2018 release of CC (version 22.1), use the Open command to import a PDF to Illustrator. Use the PDF Import Options dialog box to specify whether you want to open a single page, page range, or all pages in the PDF as linked or embedded pages in the Illustrator document. Use the Place command with the Link option selected to import a PDF (or a page in the PDF if it's a multipage document) as a single image. You can change the linked image using transformation tools. However, you cannot select and edit each component. Use the Place command with the Link Deseed option to edit the contents of a PDF. Illustrator recognizes each component of the PDF artwork and allows you to edit each component as a separate object. Use the Paste or Drag-and-Drop feature command to import selected components from a PDF, including vector objects, bitmap images, and text. Note: If you color-manage artwork in a document, embedded PDF images are part of the document and therefore color-managed when sent to a printing device. Linked PDF images, on the other hand, are not color-managed, even though color management is turned on for the rest of the document. Introduced in the March 2018 version of Illustrator CC When you open an Adobe PDF in Illustrator using the [File > Open](#) command, you specify which pages you want to import. You can open a single page, page range, or all pages. Page range settings appear in the PDF Import Options dialog box. You can display a thumbnail of a page in this dialog box before you import them. Pdf import Options A dialog box. Display a page B. Set a page number to display the C thumbnail. Import a page range D. Import all pages E. Import as a linked file in Illustrator, choose [>](#); Open. In the Open dialog box, select the PDF and click Open. In the PDF Import Options dialog box, make one of the following options: To open specific pages, select Range, and then specify the page numbers. To open the entire document, select All. Note: When you import a linked or multipage PDF, you create a new document. When you import an embedded, single-page PDF, you can either update the original PDF by using the [Save](#) command or create a new document by using the [Save As](#) command. To open the pages in the PDF as hyperlinks, select the Import PDF pages as links for optimal performance check box. Note: If you select All to import the entire PDF, this check box is selected by default, and Illustrator opens the pages as links. If you specify a page range that you want to import, this check box is deselected by default, and Illustrator integrates the pages in the document. Note: When you open a FLER-sided PDF that exceeds the canvas size, Illustrator displays error message: The complete PDF could not be opened because it exceeds the available drawing area. You can click OK to continue. When you place an Adobe PDF by using the [>](#); Place command, you specify which page you want to import. You can also how to crop the artwork by selecting the Crop to: Places the PDF page bounding box or the smallest area that encloses the objects on the page, including page tags. Places the PDF only in the area defined by a rectangle that the author has created as places-to-places artwork , such as a web page. Places only the PDF in the area displayed or printed by Adobe Acrobat. Identifies the place where the final produced page will be physically cut in the production process if trim marks are present. Places only the area that represents the area where all page contents should be cropped if there is a bleed area. This information is useful if the page is printed in a production environment. Note that the printed page may contain page marks that fall outside the bleed area. Places the area that represents the physical paper size of the original PDF document (for example, the dimensions on an A4 sheet of paper), including page tags. When you import artwork from an Adobe PDF, it's possible to introduce data that you can't create in Illustrator. This is called non-native art and includes monotonous, duotone, and tritone images. You can also generate non-original graphics in Illustrator by using the Flatten Transparency command to preserve spot colors. Note: Illustrator's ability to preserve non-native graphics is useful in many situations. For example, Illustrator retains the following information: By default, non-original graphic is labeled [&lt;Non-Native art=&gt;](#) in the Layers and Appearance panels. You can select, move, save, and perform basic transformations (such as scaling, rotation, or skewing) on non-native graphics. However, you cannot select and edit each component. In addition, you need to rasterize non-native art before editing it with softening tools. To convert non-original graphics to an Illustrator object, choose [>](#); Rasterize. That's right. There were too many things that could go wrong. Ideally, edits are made in the original application to avoid any compatibility issues and the potential nightmare of keeping track of changes between formats. However, improvements to the PDF format (thanks to Adobe Acrobat's ever-increasing functionality) in recent years have meant much more flexibility in the editing workflow. So which Adobe applications can you use to edit a PDF? Since other Adobe Creative Cloud applications like Adobe Illustrator can also save as PDF file format, it's understandable that you assume that any CC application goes when it comes to editing PDFs. However, while Adobe Illustrator is the gold standard for vector graphics applications, and although it can handle both graphics and text, it is not a PDF editor. Much of the time, though, Acrobat is the way to go. To edit a PDF in Adobe Acrobat, start Adobe Acrobat Pro, and then open the file you want to edit. When the PDF you want to edit is open, you can either click Edit PDF in the right pane: ... or use the Edit menu to select Edit Text and Pictures from the drop-down list: Now you can see that bounding boxes have appeared around any parts of editable text. After you select (click or within) a bounding box, you'll notice that the grayed-out text settings are suddenly filled and active. You can highlight the text you want to change and use the font to select a new font. You can change the font size, paragraph alignment, and leading and line spacing. You can also change the color of the type by clicking the square next to the text size (which in this case is white because the text is white) and then moving the color sliders to get the new color you selected. Adobe Acrobat Pro is a robust PDF editor and has many editing features. That said, Acrobat hits a wall when it comes to editing vector and raster graphics. Acrobat alone is not the best choice if you want to edit images. When your document images contain vector illustrations, Adobe Illustrator will be your best friend. You'll probably feel like you're taking the long way around, but trust us. We will provide you with the safest way to make point changes and keep the integrity of your document intact. What Adobe Acrobat can't handle are complex graphical edits. The good news for all of us is that if you use Adobe Creative Cloud, you'll be able to make changes pretty seamlessly across Adobe Cloud applications. Over the years, Acrobat has learned to talk to Illustrator and Photoshop, and even when edits can't be made directly in Adobe Acrobat Pro, the appropriate applications can be started (and edited) without ever closing your PDF. To get an idea of how trouble-free this process can be, first start Adobe Acrobat Pro, and then open a PDF stored on your computer. Here we open a PDF cover for a coloring book. When the document is open in Acrobat, click Edit PDF in the right panel. Now that the editing features are enabled, click around the document to select the items you might want to edit. When you do this, start comparing the available editing options. Note that the editing features in the edit panel on the right remain dimmed and inactive with some elements. This is a case where Illustrator for your rescue can come to your rescue. To edit vector graphics in the PDF with the Illustrator application, first make sure that a relevant graphic is selected (click the graphic to select Then right-click the graphic, or click a Mac, go down to Edit Use and select Adobe Illustrator from from Note: A warning dialog box may appear. If you accept the risks, then go ahead and continue. Click Yes. If Illustrator isn't already open on your computer, it will now automatically start, and a document that contains the graphic you've chosen to edit opens in the Illustrator interface. What has happened is that you have now extracted editable content from Adobe Acrobat. You'll probably notice that the artboard looks huge — it's taken on the dimensions of your Adobe Acrobat file, and your editable artwork has also carried the same location within the larger artboard. The size of this artboard is extremely important. Keeping these artboard dimensions ensures that the changes you make to Illustrator are easily written back into the Acrobat file. Also, do not change the bounding box if you want your location to remain intact in the original PDF. (Yes, there's a lot going on here, but as long as you take the right steps, your illustrations and files - and all your hard work - will be safe.) You might also notice that when Acrobat launched Illustrator, it created a new file with a crazy name consisting of random letters and numbers. The file generated and displayed in Illustrator is called a touch-up file and is only in your computer's memory. This means that it is not stored locally at the moment (but can of course be with the [File -> Save As](#) command). From Illustrator, make the changes to this touch-up file. We will change the color of this logo background box. You may notice some strange behavior when you make your changes. Because we communicate back and forth between two programs, that's perfectly normal - it just takes some getting used to. When you're done with your vector edits and ready to go back to Acrobat, go to [File -->](#); Save. Keep in mind that you're in the touch-up file, so you're saving these changes all the way back to Acrobat, NOT on your hard disk. Note that if you think you might need your changes on your own for use in the future, you can also choose [File ->](#); Save As and create a standalone vector file, stored on your hard drive. However, for our current purposes, you will immediately export your changes to your Acrobat document again without requiring additional steps. Here's an overview of the steps if you need to take advantage of Illustrator's vector editing power: Open your PDF in Adobe Acrobat. In the right panel, choose Edit PDF. Select the vector artwork you want to change. Right-click (or control) click and edit using Adobe Illustrator. Make your changes to the graphic without changing anything else about the touch-up document as started. Save your changes. Confirm your changes to the open Acrobat document. If you want to edit text in a PDF, it's usually best to stick with Adobe Acrobat. As we mentioned earlier, Adobe Illustrator is more dedicated to graphics (specifically vector) That said, if you are To open the PDF in Illustrator to edit the text, go to [>](#); open and select the PDF. If it's a multi-page PDF, you can select the page range you want to open. When the pages are open, you can click the text. In this document, you can see that the text cannot be edited because it was converted to outlines in Illustrator before the PDF was generated. If so, and you still want to edit the text, have the original font on your computer and type it again. However, if the text can be edited, a line appears or a text box appears when the text is selected, instead of shapes for individual letters. In this case, make the text changes you need, and then save the PDF again. Make sure it saves as a PDF and not a . AI file when you do this.
